ATTENTION ALL PARENTS of 2016-2017 SEVENTH GRADERS:

New State Mandated Immunization Requirements prior to entering 7th Grade

All students are to receive an additional dose of TDAP (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis) vaccine *before* entering the seventh grade. If your child received a TDAP vaccine within 5 years of entering the 7th grade (2012 or later), it meets the requirement.

Additionally, beginning with the start of the 2016-2017 school year, one dose of meningococcal vaccine is required prior to entry into the 7th grade. This requirement is met if your student has had this vaccine at any time before entering 7th grade.

Please send updated immunization records as soon as possible for the upcoming school year.



St. John the Baptist School is dedicated to preparing students for a global workforce requiring 21st century skills. To accomplish this, students in grades K-5 will have access to a greater number of devices in their classrooms and the computer lab. Every student in grades 6-8 will be issued a Chromebook for his/her exclusive school use beginning with the 2016/2017 school year.

The Chromebook for grades 6-8 will be used in classes throughout the day & taken home each evening for continued learning. In addition, SJB will continue to use Google Apps for Education, a free set of communication & collaboration tools that includes the use of Google Drive, Docs, Calendar & more. Teachers will create virtual classrooms, track document changes & progress for their students. This 1:1 program will allow the teaching staff to infuse technology & online resources in powerful new ways within classroom instruction. Students will be engaged in retrieving, manipulating, interpreting & applying information & data available through a wide variety of media. As a result we hope to enhance our learning environment by further enriching critical thinking, collaboration, communication, & creativity.

As with the start of any new project there are many questions. A few of them are listed below.

- Q: What is Google Apps for Education (GAFE)?
- Q: What is a Chromebook?
- Q: How will the Chromebooks be funded?
- Q: How is the Technology Fee used?
- Q: How will the Chromebooks be used?
- Q: Will the Chromebooks leave the building?
- Q: Can a student "opt out" of getting a device?
- Q: How will St. John's prepare for the 1:1 program in grades 6-8?
- O: How are the teachers being prepared for the new technology?
- Q: Will unsafe or inappropriate websites be filtered on the devices?
- Q: How can students submit work or assignments via their devices?
- Q: Will SJB supply my child with any Chromebook accessories, such as a protective case?
- Q: What role will textbooks play in student learning?
- Q: What training and/or support will my child receive?
- Q: How long will the Chromebook be expected to last?
- Q: Why now? This seems very fast.

<u>DEDICATED VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO FILL KEY ROLES ON THE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION BOARD!</u>

Every two years, elections are held for two of the four Board positions. This year, however, elections will be held for the roles of Vice-President and Treasurer, as well as for the role of Secretary, due to the fact that our current Secretary will no longer have a child at St. John's once her 8th grader graduates in May. The terms are two years in length and a person may serve multiple terms in a row if they are elected to do so. If you are interested in filling one of these roles, please submit your name and the role you would like to be considered for to Hub Martini at hmartini@stjb.net by wednesday, April 27. You may also submit the name of another person who you think would be a good candidate for one of these roles. However, please speak with the person you would like to nominate before emailing Hub. The Athletic Association simply cannot function without dedicated people filling these roles. Please consider stepping up and helping the coordinators and coaches to provide a great youth sports experience for our athletes. If two or more people are nominated for any of these roles, an election will be held at the next Athletic Association meeting on Monday, May 2. A brief description of each role is provided below. Vice-President

- a) Preside in the absence of the President and shall hold oneself in readiness to assist the President
- b) Secure gym time at other locations (i.e. Harrison Jr. School gym) for girls and boys volleyball and girls and boys basketball practices and games
- c) Work with coordinators and coaches to schedule practice and game times for the gyms that will be used each season
- d) Keep a master schedule of who will be using the gyms at any given time, keep track of any changes that may develop, and communicate changes to coordinators and coaches
- e) Work with the contact persons at other gym locations, the Business Manager, and the Treasurer to coordinate payments for gym time rental

Treasurer

- a) To work with and communicate with the Business Manager to prepare annual budgets, collect fees and dues, and maintain accurate records of receipts and expenditures
- b) Provide accurate, complete, and timely reports as required by the Athletic Association, the parish, the Archdiocese, and the government
- c) Pay all outstanding bills promptly upon receipt

Secretary

- a) Keep minutes of each meeting and share the minutes with the Athletic Association
- b) Take care of any correspondence that may need to be done on behalf of the Athletic Association
- c) Send out monthly meeting reminders to the members of the Athletic Association
