## A MESSAGE FROM MRS. MEYMANN

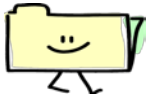
It is sometimes easy to forget the miracle taking place at Mass each week as we gather in church! The second grade students will be experiencing the Sacrament of First Holy Communion this weekend. We pray each of them carries the awe and joy of this Sacrament in their hearts as they continue on their faith journeys.

The season of test administrations has nearly reached its end. Our Iowa and CogAT results for school analysis arrived just before Easter break, and the student data is now being prepared to be sent home with families. As a school, we typically perform among the top 25% of those taking the Iowa Assessment, and that trend has continued. Both our math and reading scores are strong, across every grade level. Parent reports are being sent home next week. Please take the time to review your child's progress, noting relative strengths and weaknesses. As a staff, we use these results to identify areas of the curriculum needing further development or expansion and other results are helpful in identifying students for services such as supportive reading or our enrichment program. In the upcoming weeks, our 8th grade Algebra students will be taking the state end of course exam in the hope all will earn a high school credit for their advanced math class. Our Archdiocese Catholic High Schools have been recently awarded for how well students have been performing in their Advanced Placement classes. Many St. John the Baptist graduates will be taking such classes once they reach high school, allowing them to get a jump on their college majors.

Abraham Lincoln stopped by this week to visit the fifth through eighth grade students. Honest Abe discussed his life and the challenges that have faced our nation throughout our amazing history.



Is your child taking part in the Thursday afternoon Lego Robotics classes? About 20 of our students in second through fifth grade are being introduced to this new STEM experience. A large group of students has also communicated to me a desire for an afterschool chess club, and so we will likely be offering such a program in the fall. Whether a chess master or a beginner, all grade levels will be welcome to participate!
