The St. John the Baptist gymnasium is a busy place each evening now that winter sports practices are in full swing. Please remind those dropping students for practice to arrive after 3:45 p.m. and to enter the parking lot *slowly* from either Park or Harrison Avenue. Our bus riders are still dismissing from both buildings and heading toward Hill Street until 3:45 p.m. Please remind your children to walk carefully to cars when leaving practices after night fall as well. Finally, due to some weekend problems with vandalism, the lower level restrooms are off limits during practices and during most of the weekend. Students should be supervised at all times and should only use the restrooms nearest the first grade classrooms. Every child should be able to tell who is responsible for them at all times they are on campus. Thank you for your help with keeping our kids safely attended while on school and parish grounds.
