## **POLICY ON USING SPACE AT ST. JOHNS**

Because of security problems that have arisen during the past school year, the following policies are being put in place **as of Sunday, August 22, 2010** to ensure the safety of people and the buildings.

Any room, including classrooms, the gym, church, or cafeteria, is to be reserved through Angie Land using the reservation forms available in the back of church.

If a classroom is being used by a group that does not directly involve the teacher of that classroom, that teacher must give the group permission, but also, the room must be reserved through Angie Land.

Outside doors to the buildings are not to be propped open.

The School buildings and church must be vacated by 9:30 p.m. and the buildings will be locked at that time by the night maintenance staff.

All trash resulting from the meeting is to be removed from the room and placed in the dumpster; the room is to be returned to its regular configuration.

The computer classroom in the school is not available for meetings.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Any previous arrangement for the use of space is now changed to the above policy.
